Assignment: This summer, students entering $10^{\text {th }}$ grade will read Night by Elie Wiesel. Here is a brief synopsis of the book:

Night is Elie Wiesel's masterpiece, a candid, horrific, and deeply poignant autobiographical account of his survival as a teenager in the Nazi death camps. Night offers much more than a litany of the daily terrors, everyday perversions, and rampant sadism at Auschwitz and Buchenwald; it also eloquently addresses many of the philosophical as well as personal questions implicit in any serious consideration of what the Holocaust was, what it meant, and what its legacy is and will be. ## Directions:

- Students must take Cornell notes on the material as they read. These will be collected on Friday, September $8^{\text {th }}$.

- Aim to take about $1 / 2$ page of notes per chapter. Do not go overboard! Focus on the main themes and symbols found throughout. The main themes include:
- Having and Losing Faith in God
- Inhumanity
- Guilt, Indifference, and Inaction
- Define any difficult vocabulary you encounter.
- Students will also complete a short comprehension quiz with a writing component connected on Friday, September $8^{\text {th }}$.
- If you have received this assignment and you end up signing up for Finney late, you are STILL RESPONSIBLE to complete the summer assignment. You will receive the assignment upon your return.
